olo on Sunday 8th July included the annual Cheval Cup and fell during the long hot summer

The Cheval guests settled into sunshine and an incredible meal while watching the first half of dramatic polo between the teams Cheval Blanc and Cheval Noir.

A nail biting first half saw the scores almost tied but Cheval Noir just in the lead.

Half time also offered the brilliant opportunity to inspect the power of the horses again as guests walked onto the field to take part in stomping the divots. During play the patches of grass which are torn up by the polo horses' quick movements could be damaging. Spectators assist by walking over the field stomping back in all the loose items of grass to make the field safer for players and horses. Stomping the divot also helps spectators to understand the scale of the polo field and the speed with which player and pony transverse the ground.

The second half players fought hard and winners were Cheval Blanc captained by Gus Prentice.

The drama of the match concluded with spectators gathered around the champions to applaud the cup winners.

Mohammed Almarzooqi, Managing Director of Cheval Group, concluded what was an incredible afternoon thanking and celebrating the skill of the champion polo players.



ack on the hot Summer's Sunday that was the 10th of June Ham Polo Club came alive to some of the most extraordinary pageantry ever seen at the club. The day started with our, as ever, exciting annual Ham vs RAF match and we were privileged to hear stories of the RAF's new VTOL F35B fighter planes, the fitting successor to the much adored Harrier Jump Jet, from Air Vice Marshal Chris Nickols Hon. President of the RAF Polo Association.

But the afternoon was only just taxi-ing on to the runway...hmm polo ground... because in front of his Excellency the Japanese Ambassador 大使 Kouji Tsuruoka our longstanding Japanese partners BCS (British Country Spirit), under the guidance of their dynamic young director Haruhito Takai 高井さん, a festival of Japanese horsemanship and culture was about to begin.

First we had a tremendously colourful and memorable display of Kiba Dakyu, a game closely related to polo with its origins along the China Silk Road and said to have been played by Emperors, with a martial arts group from Hachinohe City. Takashi Yamanouchi presided as Master of Ceremonies and two skilful young riders Masanao Itabashi and Tomohisa Maeda played the game for us with traditional wooden saddles, long sticks with nets and wearing their traditional Kimono. The event, being played for the first time outside Japan was conducted gracefully and skilfully by Master Yamanouchi and his young exemplars.


BCS, HPC's partner for the past seven years, is proud to promote Britain with its polo culture, country style and heritage in Japan and the inauguration of the BCS Polo Trophy, to be played for annually at HPC, is the result of much hard past effort by Takai San, BCS's charming UK representative Ozawa San (known affectionately as Ozzie) and the whole team at Ham over the years.

Then came the BCS Polo match. This match, played in the spirit of Anglo-Japanese friendship exemplified by the increasing co-operation between the RAF and the Japanese Defence Force, was between an HPC British team and a BCS Japanese team that included star Japanese polo player Yuichiro Yoshimura one of only a few players in Japan. Yuichiro is known to all his friends as Ichiban (一番) because he's the number one player in Japan!

Ichiban is a highly capable horseman who has run a horse trekking farm for some time in Japan. Having played polo since about three years ago under the tuition and guidance in England & Argentina of Ham's polo manager Will Healy he is fast becoming a good player. During this second exciting match of a wonderfully evocative day Ichiban saw his team win by scoring the winning goal in front of a large crowd including a big contingent of the British Japanese Chamber of Commerce who had kindly supported the event thanks to the work of local resident Akemi Graham.

So in fitting fashion (forgive the pun!) the Japanese team won and BCS director Takai San presented Captain Ichiban with the new and exquisite trophy carved with the symbolic and beautiful Sakura flower on its pedestal.

leary-eyed I unlocked the office door and stepped in. Arriving at Château de Courances you are immediately struck by the grandeur of the place. But we had no time to look around as ponies and teams were waiting for us at the polo ground. Sandwiches and beer followed on the side of the pitch, a farewell to new friends and we were off again to the airport.

Mission accomplished on two fronts; during both matches we managed to get the local youngsters involved as one of us dropped out a few chukkas to let them play. And we firmly established another fixture for Ham teams in the future to play in a very beautiful and different setting.

RULES OF POLO

GENERAL

- The ground is 30 yards long, 200 yards wide.
- Each chukka is 7½ minutes. In the last chukka the game ends on the bell unless there is a tie.
- There are intervals of 3 minutes between chukkas; 5 minutes at half-time. Ends are changed after each goal.
- Each player is handicapped from -2 up to 10 goals (the best players).
- The aggregate handicap of the four players in a team is the team handicap.

FOULS

- Crossing the right of way is one of the most dangerous fouls in polo and can result in a very serious accident.
- A player following the ball on its exact line has the right of way over all players. Any other player who crosses the player on the right of way close enough to be dangerous commits a foul.
- Penalties vary according to the degree of danger and closeness of the cross.
- When travelling in the same direction a player may draw level with another and then force him across the line and take possession of the ball without committing a foul.
- A player may move in parallel with the line and play a shot, providing he can do so without interfering with another player/mount, or causing him to check back.
- Two players riding for a ball from opposite directions in the open must both give way to the left and take the ball on their right or off side.
- It is forbidden to hit across the legs of a pony.
- The elbow may not be used when riding off.
- A player may hook an opponent's stick but never across a pony or above the shoulders.
- When two players are approaching a ball in the open from different directions, the player approaching at the least angle to the line of the ball has the right of way.
- Dangerous riding or rough handling is not allowed a player may ride an opponent off.

PENALTIES

- A goal is given if the cross is dangerous or deliberate in the vicinity of the goal. The ball is thrown in 10 yards in front of the goal without ends being changed.
- Free hit from 30 yards opposite the centre of the goal –
 defenders to be behind the back line and outside the goal
 posts which they must not ride through when the ball is hit.







am Polo Club has one of the highest proportion of female playing members in the country. Played for since 1902, the Roehampton Cup is one of the oldest trophies in the UK and Ham's most prestigious tournament. Originally played for at the Roehampton Club it was one of the major trophies to win in the London season during the early 20th century. Looking at some of the early winners there were 10 goal handicapped polo players, gold medal winning olympians and war heroes. This year eight teams fought for the chance to win the prestigious trophy.

After two weeks of high level polo played out on the Black Bears Grounds in Henley, Ham team Vendetta with patron Garrie Renucci made it to the final to play Ojo Caliente. After some fantastic weather conditions for the league matches and semi finals the final was hit with some of the heaviest rain of the season. Such is the importance of the Roehampton that polo went ahead. Into the match and neither team were visibly phased by the rain with some fierce play on display.

The first half was close with Ojo Caliente gaining a narrow lead over Vendetta. In the second half Jonny

Good and Ed Banner-Eve surged ahead forging a strong lead. Vendetta were unlucky missing two opportunities in the third chukka that could have closed the gap. Both Banner-Eve and Good are top Arena polo players so might have been more used to playing in such poor conditions. By the final bell the Ojo Caliente team still had the lead to run out 2018 winners by 9 goals to 4.

After the main final Stoneyhill played Pakistan Cables for the Critchley Cup Subsidiary Final. Ed Banner-Eve straight off the back of winning the final made a substitute appearance in place of Ham regular Hamza Mowaz who had an injury prior to the match. The rain persisted however the match began in the hope that a full four chukkas of play would be possible.

Eventually Stoneyhill started to build a big lead over Pakistan Cables. Stoneyhill had the experience of ex England player Will Lucas who had most probably played his fair share of matches in British weather. The Stoneyhill team eventually ran out resounding winners to take the Critchley Trophy.



FOND MEMORIES OF THE 1970s & 80s AT HAM

n writing about Ham Polo Club in the 1970/80s, it should be remembered that we are talking about 30 to 50 years ago. Probably only a few highlights remain in the memory, along with players who graced the ground then. Two points to be made; firstly, few of those who played then are still around so not much chance of disagreement and secondly, there is no intention of spoiling a good story with the facts!!

Firstly, we should understand the Club as it then was and the aim of those playing.

The Club was a previously owned Nissen hut as would be found on an army site; it is still with us and forms the area with the bar at the end. It had been transported to the ground and erected with ladies and gents lavatories at one end where they are today. It had a veranda which covered the area where the vines are and a small members enclosure with a few off-white benches if you needed anywhere to sit.

Drinks were available, draught beer and a selection of spirits and mixers; there may have been wine or we might have brought that ourselves. This would have been with the picnic for only snacks and burgers were served from a little kitchen behind the bar which was at the other end from where it is now.

The splendid Billy Walsh would sit in a corner of the bar as a steady stream of players bought him

large whiskies (if you overlooked to do so, you found yourself relegated to the later games the next Sunday!). When he hit capacity, he would be 'helped' to the car to go home. In the early days, he drove himself but later, after several excursions onto Ham Common, this was by Ivy, his redoubtable wife! He did not enjoy this as he was summoned to depart and it spoilt his habit of giving admiring ladies a lift!!

Behind the 'pavilion' there was a fence between us and the then Cricket Club who played on what is now the Jubilee Ground. The gap was ideal for dumping anything that needed throwing away and accumulated an amazing collection of bits. It also had an outside gents loo which you only used in desperation!!

Polo was only played at the Club on Sundays to preserve the only ground. By mid August it was like a dust bowl and woe betide you if you had not got your ponies fit enough when they came in as this was when the percussion would leave them foot sore or lame.

The stables were mainly at Billy's Yard by the Ham Gate into Richmond Park with maybe 16 more in the stables where they are now at the Club run by Janet Mann, whose mother came in for a while and did the catering at the Club on Sundays. Chukkas were played on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons and Saturday morning on the ground between Sheen and

Roehampton Gates. The ponies were ridden there by players and grooms and tethered on temporary wooden post and rail. This created a slight crisis when two of Denzil Fernandes's spooked and broke free and disappeared at a gallop out of Sheen Gate with the rail dangling between them from their halters!! It was decided it was safer to string rope lines in the trees by the road and each chukka day Billy's Morris Estate car would trundle up to the ground with the roof rack carrying the posts and the inside filled with ropes, buckets, halters and a mass of other bits! At the end of chukkas we were all expected not only to tread in but also pack up all the kit and lines.

One of the benefits of this set-up was that the ponies warmed up on their way to the ground and cooled down on their way back. If it was very hot, it was always a treat to let them wade through Penn Ponds as they returned. It was advisable to stick to the shallower water as Pam Bannister discovered when she went too far out and over the ledge into deep water. The pony swam out and Pam just about followed, unfortunately without her boots which had filed with water, come off and sunk to the bottom!!

And, if you were not happy with only playing four days a week, you could always go out in your own time on the stick and ball ground just inside Ham Gate.

There were tutored sessions on Wednesday and Friday afternoons and all players were expected to school their ponies on Saturday mornings. No wonder you could see the altar between Andy Arghyrou's knees at his wedding!! The tutored sessions cost £5 for an hour!!

It must be time to move onto the players but that is very difficult because to write about all of them would take this whole publication!

Where on earth therefore to start or indeed to stop? The easy ones are Billy Walsh about whom enough has been written but, there again, you could write a book about him. His daughter, Peggy Healy, who was put on every new horse and expected to stay there! As a result, she was one of the most accomplished riders you could know. Her husband, David, who was American and a well-known actor; his vocal strains could not only be heard on stage or film but across the ground, normally commenting on his or his horse's ability!

Actors also came in the form of Sir John Mills and his lovely wife, Mary. He was prevented from playing eventually by his insurance but they and their daughters came over from Denham to watch for the afternoon. In contrast, Jimmy 'Whacko' Edwards would appear and normally insist on commentating. After several vodka and oranges, the language became appalling and the insults on the players' ability appalling but hilarious with the 'f' word frequently included! Needless to say, the crowd loved it!

Jimmy was an ardent player and used big ponies to carry his weight so a formidable one too. So was Edward Tauchert, Christopher's father and indeed, Christopher, who was one of the most fearless players. He rode his ponies which he had diligently got fit and trained with superb panache and skill, making him a very useful player. In that same bracket would be included Derek Copeland and Sam Houston. Eduardo Moore, the Cambiaso of those days, referred to Derek as one of the best trainers of three quarter thoroughbreds he had seen. Sam was also renowned for his meticulous training not only his ponies but himself! With a reputation for playing every shot perfectly, he was a joy to watch and spending hours with the two of them schooling horses and learning tactics was what polo was all about. To that duo Peter Adams, who was a brilliant commentator with the finest eye for detail, should be added. Before each game he would go down to the pony lines and note helmet colours and pony's names so that he could produce a perfect commentary. On Sunday evenings, this group would go to the Chinese by Richmond bus garage and continue the analysis over supper - much testing the patience of the wives/partners!

The Club also saw, thanks to Peter, the first modern charity days with Prince Charles coming to play with a squad of fellow notable players including his polo manager, Major Ronald Ferguson.

Roy de Lisser and his lovely wife, Ann, who came over from Jamaica each year for the season (he was quite large and complained loudly if the team shirts were too tight!). Robert Young, the film director and his talented and attractive wife, Hermione; he made a film of the origins of English polo which can still be found on YouTube. Lots of members were recruited and, supplemented by stars like Julian Hipwood, Paul Withers, Reddy Watt and John Horswell, were made up and dressed for the period. It is hilarious to watch!

In the 70s and 80s many players came and went most on to play at a higher level. Two, Bryan Morrison and David Anderson, to found the Royal Berkshire and Epsom Polo Clubs respectively. The Club went through the crisis of being down to single figures in the late 70s to having a healthy 40 plus in the 80s. We also saw the first commercially sponsored polo team by the Yves St Laurent men's range, Kouros, who ran a low goal team out of Ham and a high goal team out of Cowdray.

And many stayed. Nicholas Colquhoun-Denvers, Chris Tauchert, Quentin Davis, Michael Wellman, Michael Ventura and there must be others, have all been stalwart supporters of the Club since those days. And one of the joys has been to see their children take up polo and develop into today's players.

It has always been the case, and certainly was then, that old players love to come back to Ham to play. At this time we saw many and, although players travelled little, the Club was still well-recognised through this old comradeship. That and the annual trips to Rhinefield, Cowdray, Guards and Tidworth, and indeed the characters who went on them, kept Ham's name at the forefront of the UK's clubs.



ark Beaumont, the photographer who captured these stunning equine portraits, is no stranger to Ham Polo Club. One of his earliest memories is visiting his grandfather who lived in Ham and being taken to watch polo there.

It was many years later in 2013 that he was back at Ham, but this time as the Club's photographer for the season. It wasn't long though before he was approached and asked if he'd like to work for the King Power Polo team, photographing all their matches culminating in their high goal hat trick.

In between the polo tournaments and throughout the rest of the year he specialises in creating these stunning equine images. He uses a mixture of carefully controlled high powered studio lighting and ambient light to create the dramatic shots without the use of photoshop. Originally planning a career in theatrical lighting, it was by chance Mark discovered photography and particularly the magic of the darkroom. It was there where he spent the next 10 years working in professional photographic laboratories in central London. However his strong connection with the countryside, and particularly his love of horses, led him to a project to try and capture them in a way that had rarely been seen before.

Not surprisingly, within no time at all, she was fulfilling the same role there as she had at Ham. Once again, her calm demeanour saw the club through many difficult situations and it was touching to see how the few members who are left attended her funeral.

It is a shame that there are not more Molly Walkers in the world; in spite of the difficulties that she faced in life, she never complained but was happy with her lot and concentrated on putting others' needs ahead of her own. An example to us all.

Marcus was a playing member at Ham Polo Club in the 70s and 80s and will be fondly remembered by those around at the time. Marcus first came to the club aged 17 to have riding and polo lessons with Billy Walsh. 
JOHN ROBSON

VICHAI SRIVADDHANAPRABHA

APRIL 1957- OCTOBER 2018

It was with deep sadness and regret that we all received the dreadful news of Vichai Srivaddhanaprabha's death in a helicopter accident at his beloved Leicester City Football Club. Vichai was Ham Polo Club's President from 2008 to 2012 and he served and supported our club with distinction and great charm through those years and well beyond. Vichai's love of polo almost rivalled that of football and we were lucky to know and have him as a member of Ham. For most people Vichai will be best remembered for the huge success he had at Leicester City Football Club. Vichai took the club from the Championship Football Division to the winners of the Premier League in the space of six years.

After joining Ham as a player in the early 2000s Vichai went on to found VR Polo Club in Thailand which is one of the main clubs in the country. Over the next two decades Vichai and his sons Aiyawatt and Apichet, known as Top and Tip, with the King Power Polo Team became one of the most successful teams in British history. King Power won the British Open at Cowdray Park three times in 2015,2016 and 2017 as well as the Queen's Cup in 2015.

In 2012, the King of Thailand Bhumibol Adulyadej bestowed the family the new surname of Srivaddhanaprabha, which means "light of progressive glory". This was in recognition of his charity work and success in business. Vichai was also awarded an honorary doctorate as a Doctor of Laws by the University of Leicester in 2016.

Vichai displayed immense generosity supporting countless charity days at Ham all raising funds for worthy causes. Most recently he sponsored the King Power Laureus Sport for Good event.

As a club we will sorely miss Vichai and his generosity to those around him. His mark in the polo world and especially at Ham is that which will be remembered for generations to come.





